[*The Truth Will Make You Free*] So Jesus was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, "If you continue in My word, *then* you are truly disciples of Mine; John 8:30-32 (in Context) John 8 (Whole Chapter)

13. **John 8:32**

You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

Jesus returned, "Believe me when I tell you that every man who commits sin is a slave. For a slave is no permanent part of a household, but a son is. I am telling you what I have seen in the presence of my Father, and you are doing what you have seen in the presence of your father."

[A brief resume—the consequence of sin and the gift of God] This, then, is what happened. Sin made its entry into the world through one man, and through sin, death. The entail of sin and death passed on to the whole human race, and no one could break it for no one was himself **free** from sin.

But the **free** gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one the many died, much more did the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abound to the many.

When you were slaves to sin, you were **free** from the control of righteousness.

o For when you were slaves of sin, you were free from allegiance to righteousness. So what fruit was produced then from the things you are now ashamed of? For the end of those things is death. But now, since you have been liberated from sin and have become enslaved to God, you have your fruit, which results in sanctification—and the end is eternal life! For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

26. **Romans 7:4**

There is, I think, a fair analogy here. The death of Christ on the cross had made you "dead" to the claims of the Law, and you are **free** to give yourselves in marriage, so to speak, to another, the one who was raised from the dead, that you may be productive [or bear fruit] for God.

While we were "in the flesh" the Law stimulated our sinful passions and so worked in our nature that we became productive—for death! But now that we stand clear of the Law, the claims which existed are dissolved by our "death", and we are **free** to serve God not in the old obedience to the letter of the Law, but in a new way, in the spirit.

28. Romans 7:21-25

When I come up against the Law I want to do good, but in practice I do evil. My conscious mind whole-heartedly endorses the Law, yet I observe an entirely different principle at work in my nature. This is in continual conflict with my conscious attitude, and makes me an unwilling prisoner to the law of sin and death. In my mind I am God's willing servant, but in my own nature I am bound fast, as I say, to the law of sin and death. It is an agonizing situation, and who on earth can set me **free** from the clutches of my sinful nature? I thank God there is a way out through Jesus Christ our Lord.

29. Romans 7:24

Wretched man that I am! Who will set me **free** from the body of this death?

30. **Romans 8:1-3**

Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of **the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death**. For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh

that the creation itself will also be set **free** from the bondage of corruption into the glorious freedom of God's children.

Who would dare to accuse us, whom God has chosen? The judge himself has declared us **free** from sin. Who is in a position to condemn? Only Christ, and Christ died for us, Christ rose for us, Christ reigns in power for us, Christ prays for us!

For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be **free** from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and you will be commended.

34. 1 Corinthians 7:22

For he who is called by the Lord as a slave is the Lord's freedman. Likewise he who is called as a **free** man is Christ's slave.

35. 1 Corinthians 7:35

I tell you these things to help you; I am not putting difficulties in your path but setting before you an ideal, so that your service of God may be as far as possible **free** from worldly distractions.

36. 1 Corinthians 9:16

If I do this work because I choose to do so then I am entitled to a reward. But if it is no choice of mine, but a sacred responsibility put upon me, what can I expect in the way of reward? This, that when I preach the Gospel, I can make it absolutely **free** of charge, and need not claim what is my rightful due as a preacher. For though I am no man's slave, yet I have made myself everyone's slave, that I might win more men to Christ.

37. 1 Corinthians 9:19

Although I am a **free** man and not anyone's slave, I have made myself a slave to everyone, in order to win more people.

38. Galatians 5:1

[Walk by the Spirit] It was for freedom that Christ set us **free**; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery.

39. Galatians 5:13-14

It is to freedom that you have been called, my brothers. Only be careful that freedom does not become mere opportunity for your lower nature. You should be **free** to serve each other in love. For after all, the whole Law toward others is summed up by this one command, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself'.

But if freedom means merely that you are **free** to attack and tear each other to pieces, be careful that it doesn't mean that between you, you destroy your fellowship altogether!

[The way to live in freedom is by the Spirit] Here is my advice. Live your whole life in the Spirit and you will not satisfy the desires of your lower nature. For the whole energy of the lower nature is set against the Spirit, while the whole power of the Spirit is contrary to the lower nature. Here is the conflict, and that is why you are not **free** to do what you want to do. But if you follow the leading of the Spirit, you stand clear of the Law.

42. Ephesians 5:25-27

But, remember, this means that the husband must give his wife the same sort of love that Christ gave to the Church, when he sacrificed himself for her. Christ gave himself to make her holy, having cleansed her through the baptism of his Word—to make her an altogether glorious Church in his eyes. She is to be **free** from spots, wrinkles or any other disfigurement—a Church holy and perfect.

43. **Colossians 1:22**

But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and **free** from accusation—

[The old Law can't condemn you now] In Christ, you were circumcised, not by any physical act, but by being set **free** from the sins of the flesh by virtue of Christ's circumcision.

But now put all these things behind you. No more evil temper or furious rage: no more evil thoughts or words about others, no more evil thoughts or words about God, and no more filthy conversation. Don't tell each other lies any more, for you have finished with the old man and all he did and have begun life as the new man, who is out to learn what he ought to be, according to the plan of God. In this new man of God's design there is no distinction between Greek and Hebrew, Jew or Gentile, foreigner or savage, slave or **free** man. Christ is all that matters for Christ lives in them all.

46. 2 Thessalonians 3:8

we did not eat anyone's food **free** of charge; instead, we labored and struggled, working night and day, so that we would not be a burden to any of you.

As a general rule it should be taken for granted that any Christian, man or woman, who has a widow in the family, should do everything possible for her, and not allow her to become the church's responsibility. The church will then be **free** to look after those widows who are alone in the world

Do not lay hands upon anyone *too* hastily and thereby share *responsibility for* the sins of others; keep yourself **free** from sin.

Obey every man-made authority for the Lord's sake—whether it is the emperor, as the supreme ruler, or the governors whom he has appointed to punish evil-doers and reward those who do good service. It is the will of God that you may thus silence the ill-informed criticisms of the foolish. As **free** men you should never use your freedom as an excuse for doing something that is wrong, for you are at all times the servants of God. You should have respect for everyone; you should love our brotherhood, fear God and honor the emperor.

57. 1 Peter 2:16

As God's slaves, live as **free** people, but don't use your freedom as a way to conceal evil.

58. **1 John 3:4-6**

[Conduct will show who is a man's spiritual father] Everyone who commits sin breaks God's law, for that is what sin is, by definition—a breaking of God's law. You know, moreover, that Christ became man for the purpose of removing sin, and he himself was quite **free** from sin. The man who lives "in Christ" does not habitually sin. The regular sinner has never seen or known him.
