I just want to wish you guys a very Merry Christmas. I also want to thank you for the opportunity you've given me over the years. The opportunity to follow the Lord's leading and direction. When I started with you I had no clue what the Lord going to do in my life. I remember thinking, "There is no way I could ever go into a jail and teach a Bible study, let alone in a jail and even worse with people I do not know."

I remember on the way to Lino Lakes [when the medium security adult units were there] to teach the first study by myself. I was listening to music in my car and talking to the Lord. I remember thinking "What am I doing? ... I must be crazy." A song by Casting Crowns came on right then. It was about not being afraid and Peter walking on the water, the very lesson I was going to teach.

Since that day nothing has ever been the same. Through jail ministry I have learned to wait on the Lord and not run ahead of Him. Through jail and prison ministry my faith in Him and who He is has grown leaps and bounds. Through prison ministry the Lord has created a job for me, designed perfectly by Him for me. How cool it is that?! (Because she put so many hours into, and did such an effective job at her volunteer position, Kay was hired part time by the Volunteers of America.) I know that I am in the right place for "such a time as this", I have never felt this before.

So I really do not think that "Thank You" even begins to say how grateful I am for you and all you do. I look forward to the next years to see where the Lord leads you and I look forward to being a part of that.
