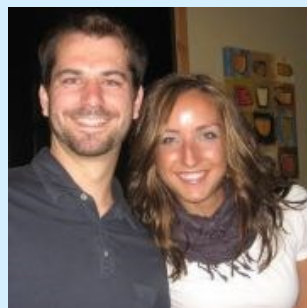

Romans 5:16 NASB The gift is not like *that which came* through the one who sinned; for on the one hand the judgment *arose* from one *transgression* resulting in condemnation, but on the other hand the **free** gift *arose* from many transgressions resulting in justification.

Romans 6:7 NIV because anyone who has died [to self] has been set **free** from sin.

Romans 6:18 NIV You have been set **free** from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.

Romans 6:20-23 For when you were slaves of sin, you were free from allegiance [in regard to, from control of] to sin, to righteousness. So what fruit was produced then from the things you are now ashamed of? For the end of those things is death. But now, since you have been liberated from sin and have become enslaved to God, you have your fruit, which results in sanctification—and the end is eternal life! For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 7:21-25 J.B. Phillips NT When I come up against the Law I want to do good, but in practice I do evil. My conscious mind whole-heartedly endorses the Law, yet I observe an entirely different principle at work in my nature. This is in continual conflict with my conscious attitude, and makes me an unwilling prisoner to the law of sin and death. In my mind I am God's willing servant, but in my own nature I am bound fast, as I say, to the law of sin and death. It is an agonizing situation, and who on earth can set me **free** from the clutches of my sinful nature? I thank God there is a way out through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Romans 7:24 NASB Wretched man that I am! Who will set me **free** from the body of this death?

Romans 8:1-3 NASB Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of **the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.** For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh

Romans 8:21 HCSB that the creation itself will also be set **free** from the bondage of corruption into the glorious freedom of God's children.
