Problem Thinking & the Lord's Healing: **Bad Pride/Good Pride**

Pride is a challenge to write about. We all have it; it can be extremely negative, have horrible effects and can disguise itself. In reviewing Biblical verses on pride I found that we can also have pride in good things. What we have pride in is extremely important.

Old Testament verses indicate that Pharaoh (Gen 9:17), Ruben (Gen 49), Israel (several), Adonijah (I King 19), Hezekiah (2 Chron. 17), and Nebuchadnezzar (Dan. 4) reflected pride by not respecting the LORD. (Numb 15). It is associated with loftiness, arrogance, haughtiness and deceit, and lack of concern. It is borne and it grows (Jer. 48 & 49, Ezk. 7, 16 & 30, Hos. 7) This was reflected by not paying attention to (Deut. 1), not giving thought to (Deut. 10) and going against (I Sam. 15) His commands, His priests and His wishes. Those that spoke words as if they were of God when they were not (Deut. 18), trust or work in their own strength and not God's (Deut. 32, Judges 7), worked against God's people (Gen 9, Ps. 36, Zeph. 2), were proud and had arrogance, wrath, cursing, lying, & foolish, perverted or uncontrolled speech (Prov. 11&14, Isa. 16, I Sam. 2, Ps. 59), wanted to make themselves king (I King. 19), gave no return for the benefit they received and had stiff necks shown by paying no attention to God's orders (Neh. 9), did things God did not ordain them to do (2 Chron. 25 & 26),



Bad Pride/Good Pride Cont. stuffed themselves, were idle and persecuted or did not strengthen the poor (Ps. 10, Ezk. 16), do not seek God or keep Him in their thoughts, (Ps.10, Hos. 7), got drunk (Isa. 28) and replaced what God cut down with their own solu-



tions without seeking God's (Isa. 9). The proud are called mockers, scoffers, and haughty (Prov. 21), Pride brought wrath and punishment, wasteland and testing on themselves and others (Lev. 6, Deut. 8, Deut. 17). It compasses people as a chain and is associated with violence which is like a garment, (Ps. 73), brings shame, dishonor, disgrace, strife and contention, (Prov. 11 & 13) humbles or brings people low (Prov. 29), doesn't see the end of a matter, (Ecc. 7) and precedes destruction and falls (Prov. 16, Hos. 5).

God hates pride and arrogance, evil conduct and perverted speech. (Prov. 8) God saves those that are in trouble and makes the proud become low (2 Sa. 22). He wants to put negative pride to death, stain it, bring contempt to it (Isa. 23) mar it (Jer. 13), bring wrath on it, bring it down & us down from it, (Deut. 10, Jer. 13 & 49, Isa. 23& 25) make it low (Deut. 8), dispose and abase it, despoil it and cut it off (Zech 9 & 11) in order to bring positives, (Dan. 4 & 5) He weeps deeply in secret with tears running down His face over us if we have pride (Jer. 13)

Other OT verses indicate that God sees and knows the motivations of our hearts (Josh. 22), that hearts can be circumcised and pride put away (Deut. 10), pride of hearts can be broken (Lev. 26), people can be accused of pride when they have the right motives (I Sam. 17), we can repent (2 Chron. 32, Dan. 4) and our hearts can be lifted up in the ways of Yahweh (2Chron. 17). Pharaoh did not humble himself and was destroyed. (Ex. 14, Ps. 136) Hezekiah (2Chron. 32) and Nebuchad-

suicide impeded him until he turned his life over to God and committed to follow Christ. He had some great pastors and teachers who helped Him grow in the Lord. He was at a retreat praying for God to use him when Jim Johnson sat down to talk and Peter shared his story, which led to Jim inviting him to share with those in WCJ. Peter's sharing of the gospel and bringing men from sin to fruits of the Spirit reminds me of I Tim. 1:16 17 "But for that very reason I was shown mercy so that in me, ... Christ Jesus might display his immense patience as an example for those who would believe in him and receive eternal life."



Keith Heintz has been involved in WCJ since 2001. His testimony is reflected in his love for his family (He and Beth have 5 children) and the ministry. He has

coordinated schedules and gotten others involved. He shares, "Thank you for sponsoring this ministry. I still remember the day I heard Saul on KKMS... I felt the Lord calling me to [it] even though I wasn't ready to lead, — or so I thought.

I partnered with Ken Dobbs. This was a huge blessing as he knew his Bible more than anyone I had ever met, and challenged me to lean it. I can safely say that, over time, God took my weaknesses, and turned them into strengths. I used to cringe if more than 4 people came; now the Lord has me hope and pray for 16 guys each time. I am by far more blessed than the men who attend. God has shown me that I am no different because we all have sinned and therefore desperately need Jesus as Savior. I thank God for allowing me to do this."



Paul Manders was "very confused about who God really is and His plan for us, but fireworks went off when he really read the bible ... and understood the truth about Jesus. He was broken, knowing full well that "I can't earn my salvation, but rather needed to place all my trust in a savior, our Lord Jesus Christ." His favorite verse is Rev. 21:3 "and I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and he will dwell with them, and they

shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God." ... I really love jail ministry because individuals are seeking for change. They are in the valley and do not want to be there. Meeting them where they are and helping them turn around ... I love their desire to hear about the Lord."

Kyle Loing went through confirmation, but social use with friends and confronting his mother's death from alcohol was difficult. When he got engaged, premarital counseling coursework was extremely important in bringing him back to personal faith in God. Neighbors brought them to Bible based fellowship, pointed them to church and mentored them.. 2 Corinthians 5:17 "if anyone is in Christ he is a new creation" reminds me that He has washed me of my sins and I am completely new and




free from sin." Listening, encouraging, serving, sharing fellowship & the gospel, and building others up are Kyles gifts.



Paul Kuivinen Paul came to Christ in 1972 at age nine. He was saved from a life of meaningless self-service and in Argentina in 1987, realized the most significant thing he could do was to invest in the souls of others. His references share that "He has the gift of mercy, compassion, teaching, hospitality and is a wonderful lover of people. Serving as one of Rock Point's international overseas & local workers and a mentor, Paul loves God and others deeply - especially the down

cast and struggling. He is able to lead people into the Bible and help them discover their need before God, [Christ's salvation] and God's love for them."

Paul Ylonen's reports reflect the topics he and others are teaching and how they are related to the specific concerns of the men they are ministering to. He includes information about the men's struggles, their strengths and the potential they have for ministering to those in their units. Ylonen also includes encouragement for his team members and encourages new volunteers to be involved.




Bad Pride/Good Pride Cont . nezzar (Dan. 4) were humbled and humbled themselves and found grace and honor again.

Deut. 10: 12b-13 says ...what does the Lord your God ask of you except to fear the Lord your God by walking in all His ways, to love

Him, and to worship the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul? Keep the Lord's commands and statutes I am giving you today, for your own good."

In the New Testament Paul confronts those who have pride in sins so grievous that pagans don't do them, appearance over truth (Mt. 23, 2 Cor.5, James 2), knowledge without love (1 Cor. 13), thinking ourselves better than others, lust for what is in the world (1Jn. 2) and passing judgement before God's time (I Cor. 4). Pride is listed with other sins such as people loving themselves and money, given to bitter words, never giving praise, not seeking God, not listening to authority or not having any religion (2 Tim. 3), having no true knowledge – but being crazy over discussions and controversies which bring ...quarrels and suspicions, adulteries, greed, evil actions, deceit, promiscuity, stinginess, blasphemy, thefts, covetousness, wickedness, lewdness, an evil eye, blasphemy, hated by God, without respect, full of loud talk, evil intentions, not honoring father or mother, lustful



We have no reason for pride because our salvation and standing with God is a gift, the reasoning of man is useless and it is only because of God's wisdom and power that we have this gift and belong to Him (Rom. 2 & I Cor. 3), thus we should do His work without pride (Acts 20, Rom. 3 & 11)

Scripture gives us what to do with pride. Circumcise the heart and put it away (Duet.8) Fear the Lord is to hate evil. (Prov.8) Put away the pride, dirt ... and evil (1Pe. 5), Seek humility & wisdom (Prov. 1 &11) Listen now; not hardening our hearts (Heb. 3), Take in The Word without pride (Ja. 1) and Let love be the most important. (1 Cor. 8 & 13). We can take pride in God, His word and His people. God is without pride and taking His yoke brings rest. (Mt. 9:11)

See the adjacent chart to see what scripture says to take pride in.

So we need to ask ourselves, what do we glory in?

- ♦ The things which are written Scripture (1 Cor. 4)
- Not charging for the gospel, being compelled, obligated and a steward to preach (1 Cor. 9)
- ♦ A life of dying, dying daily (I Cor. 15, 2 Cor.7)
- ♦ Giving (2Cor. 9) ♦ Making yourself low (1Pe. 5)
- ♦ Untroubled mind, faith in trouble and sorrows (2 Thes. 1)
- Authority to build up believers (2 Cor. 10)
- Hebrew, descendant of Abraham, Servant of Christ, imprisoned, lashed, beaten with rods, stoned, shipwrecked, in danger, labor, hardship, hunger, thirst, exposure, daily concern for the church and individuals (2 Cor. 11)
- ♦ Weakness, being feeble God's strength (2 Cor. 12)
- ♦ His own work, not charging for the gospel (Gal. 6)
- ♦ In me is increased by being with you by my presence, -being with you- (Phil. 1)
