Problem Thinking and the Lord's Healing— Sentimentality part 2

In Sentimentality part 1 we looked at the definition of the word – "appealing to the emotions especially in an excessive way." We talked about how sentimentality can be a good thing, but can also be used to block out guilt, conviction and negative feelings. We addressed the idea that Scripture tells us that "The human heart is the most deceitful..." but also points out the way to healing and forgiveness – in part two of Sentimentality we look further at our need to turn to God for Salvation, which involves true forgiveness and change.

There is a need to recognize the negative in drugs, in alcohol, in our attitudes which block us from God and others. When we or those around us have attitudes that make the bad seem good, it blocks us from changing. One example is that "The biggest influence on our eating habits are the people around us". (From a Daniel Plan video) If junk food is the norm, we do not realize the negative effects until we make the changes and feel the benefits of more energy, clearer thinking, positive emotions and better relationships. When the pastor started the Daniel plan and helped others see the need to honor God in this way, parents started telling him, "The children are responding better in relationships and



behavior. They are learning more and doing better in school." If we look at these negative things (such as junk food, alcohol, anger) as good we are not going to want change them. If we do not recognize our sin, we do not know our Savior. We will not understand what He has given for us and what He has accomplished for us, and what good we can experience that will replace the pain.

One inmate told me that knowing God was good, caused him to avoid Him. The idea that even in the midst of his criminal activity he was as honest, truthful

and kind as he could be was a block to seeing the harm he had done. The enormity of changing His thinking to being on God's side and letting God change our minds and hearts is something to be grasped. When another gentleman who was struggling with chronic relapse grasped the concept that he could not change himself, relief was visible; he put it simply. "You mean that I cannot change myself, but that I need to cry out to God to change me? "The response, "Yes, that is it!" and then be open to cooperating with God in making those changes.





Another story is of a man who was deep into methamphetamines. He had to come to another state to start over and avoid the mafia. Even then, he lost everything more than once. In his last major relapse, he asked Christ to take away his sins, He felt, "that God was saying 'no'. He thought, 'what do you mean? You are Jesus and that is what you do'. He felt Christ say to him, "Pick them up and hand them to me one by one." As he did so, it was the first time he realized the hurt and destruction he had caused in his and in other's lives. It was overwhelmingly painful and as he cried out to God then, he felt an overwhelming love that he had never felt before. Previous to that he had read the Bible in order to find out what he should do. Now he understood the grace, mercy, and compassion of God. God became a loving Father to him. The process of new life began and true change began to take place.

Whether a seemingly big problem or a small one, take it to the cross, understand and embrace full forgiveness. Know that you can leave it there. And that the cleansing gives you a new start. Incorporate the change into the new way of life. (2 Cor. 5)

Most definitions of addiction include the concept of dependence. It all goes back to who we trust. Do we trust the item or the person that will not bring life or do we trust the true life giver.? We may believe in Him , but to live fully, also need to believe Him, that includes

evil. It is you that delivers us from the deceiver, deception, hurt, and evil. Thank you for defeating the evil one with Your life, death, and resurrection. Help me to acknowledge, accept, and live it in.

For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. - Forever is a long time but we long for that security that the good will not be taken away.
