Understanding Corrosion and Cutoff
Can Help us Resist Temptation

Deterrents are things that keep someone from committing a crime or falling to temptation. Principles, values, ideas and morals are internal deterrents. Those who would catch or discover and administer negative consequences or withhold rewards, such as parents, teachers, bosses or police and the court system are external deterrents.

God has given us all a conscience.

In order to do wrong a person has to argue with it or ignore it. Romans 2:15 ESV says, "They show that the work of the law is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness, and their conflicting thoughts accuse or even excuse them." The process of temptation is that thoughts



come that indicate something wrong is desirable and one chooses between the desire for good or wrong. Corrosion and Cutoff is where deterrents are minimized or ignored, they are “slowly eliminated until the desire to commit the act outweighs the fears. Internal deterrents corrode as the ... criminal gives way to the desire for excitement ... which is an antidote to both the zero state and to boredom. Cutoff is ... rapid and deliberate” ... [replacing fear with excitement]. This process produces fragmentation that we wrote about in an earlier article. Because values are in the mind and heart, good may be done

Many of the inmates have children in foster care or have lost their parental rights. There are around 10,000 children in Foster care in Minnesota alone. 1000 of these have had their parental rights terminated and are in need of adoption. They need forever families. Reel Hope started in September



(and build up the person's conception of themselves) before the crime is committed. The conclusion I see from Samenow and Yorkelson's writing about corrosion and cutoff is this. The fear of getting caught or punished and the harm that would result provides an emotional state that is chosen over boredom. The idea of getting caught or other deterrents are replaced with cutting off the fear by planning or scheming the action and/or ways not to get caught

These ideas relate to temptation like this. Thoughts of any temptation can be something that feels better than not feeling good (about ourselves, a situation, others or health) or not having purpose and meaning in life. When thoughts prick our conscience, reasons we should not do this or the possibility that we might get caught occurs, choosing to dwell on the temptation or the pleasure it brings overrides feeling low. Continuing to dwell on the temptation and planning ways to get by with it are placed over the negatives or deterrents. This numbs the conscience and the temptation can become habit. I Tim. 4 says that in the latter time, some people will be hypocritical liars who teach false ideas. They will have consciences that will be numb. John 3:says that people will chose what they want - the darkness more than the light of Christ.



In order to avoid this and to keep the light and love of Christ foremost in our minds and hearts it is imperative to learn the Word. In a letter that addresses wanting to stay with their commitment to Christ amidst the temptations that they will face when they leave the jail, I summarize many of the concepts in Deuteronomy where God addressed those leaving the wilderness and going into the promised land. The principles of

the instructions Moses gave to the Israelites to remember God's power and to love and obey Him are the same as what will help us now.

You have been here long enough, keep moving and move into the promised land I am giving you. Choose some respected men to help you. Do not be afraid, know that I am the LORD your God and will go before you and fight for and help you. Do not complain or bicker, but trust God. Learn and Know His commandments, precepts and regulations. Obey wholeheartedly and with enthusiasm. Destroy and leave evil - Do not compromise with the enemy or the world. Offer gifts worthy of God. - Accept Him and His power, give thanks, offer material wealth, pray, give your body and life for Him, have faith, walk in obedience and love, do good deeds and share with those in need, worship, fear and love the LORD your God with all your heart, soul and strength and love your neighbor as yourself.
