# Healing from Trauma and Forgiveness

It is a blessing to have a Memorial Day to remember those who have served and those who have gone before us and passed on. Remembering their lives helps us to grieve and to bond with others to go forward. Memories can be good and bring hope but there are memories that can be painful. When grieving, other memories of trauma can come to mind. Sometimes those are so traumatic that they hold us back. Processing those to attain healing is important.

When we experience trauma, it affects the brain to create a high vigilance for preventing further trauma and a defensiveness towards other interactions. Confrontations or conflict can activate the brain to feel like or to cause further trauma. Many who serve



in a war or experience traumatic incidences such as a shooting or a loved one dies, dramatically experience trauma and are usually aware of it, but not the total effects that it has. People who may not have experienced trauma that is as obvious are coming to find that they have experienced trauma from relationship interactions as they were growing

up. More people are being diagnosed with PTSD from relationship trauma which they might not realize has affected them causing this high vigilance or defensiveness. Helplessness and lack of control are the strongest factors that cause chemicals that produce harm in the brain while experiencing trauma. (Emotional Intelligence, by Daniel Goleman pg.205) Sometimes it is obvious, but other times it is less evident and the trauma becomes accepted as a normal part of life.

Some people who experience lack of support and/or trauma use drugs or alcohol; others cope in ways that are not recognized. Family members of addicts, those who are

mentally or physically ill, or abusers are affected by trauma in a different but just as significant way. The addict or alcoholic may receive services and the recovering person may receive attention for their accomplishments and bond with other people in their recovery circles, while the family members' needs are overlooked or told they are sick. Sometimes actions or attitudes that are healthy and would produce good results or interactions if the other individu-

al were healthy, end up with negative results. Often trying to talk about their hurt or needs brings on negative reactions from others. Family members sometimes need to figure out how to live with dysfunction, with less support.

In healthy situations when a trauma occurs relearning takes place such as, someone having a negative encounter with water and then later learning to swim. When trauma is experienced and the relearning does not occur, the trauma repeats itself in the memories and in the defenses to other situations.



Six concepts in the healing process stand out:



It's not denial I am just selective about the reality I

- 1) Denying the event or the level of the impact of the event can prevent healing.
- 2) A person's brain operates on three levels of energy. We are only able to relate to, connect

to others and learn new material if we are operating in the center level. Leaning about and recognizing this is helpful.

- 3) There are helpful processes that contribute to healing.
  - 4) It is often when affirmation or love is expressed that pain surfaces and needs to be addressed.
    - 5) And once healing takes place the memory or trigger is not gone but does allow us to recognize and choose how we will react to it.
