What do We Do While We Wait?



Waiting is hard. Noah waited for rain and then had to rebuild his entire life. Abraham waited for a son. Joseph waited from his birth for acceptance from his brothers, from the time he was 17 until he was reunited with his family and to be able to be with and provide for them. David waited from the time he was anointed to be King until he was and that was fraught with conflict. Daniel waited in captivity through at least three kings. The Messiah was promised thousands of years before Christ came. Israel waited for their savior and we wait for Christ's return.

Within the larger context of waiting here are examples of individuals who waited. The people waited for Zechariah wondering at his delay in the temple. (Luke 1) Simeon & Anna waited for the consolation and redemption of Israel (Luke 2)

What do we do while we are waiting? Many in Israel turned to other gods, Daniel served the kings while he was in captivity, was one who used the time to "learn (ed) from reading the Word of the LORD" (Daniel 9:2b). He pleaded with God in prayer and fasting, [repeating God's promises]... Praising Him as 'Great and awesome...confessing his, the peoples and the ancestor's sin ... shame ... disobedience ... and refusal to listen, and wickedness. Here is year end review and a sincere **thank you** for your prayers and support. As the years have gone by and the ministry has expanded it is always a blessing to add. This year although it is less than it has been in the past, it is good to rely to you what the LORD is still doing.

We thank you for helping provide these.

- 66 Church Services, Bible Studies, Individual Spiritual Counseling or Topical Outreach classes each week.
- Volunteers minister to around 530 individuals a week (some come to more than one service)
- For the 16 jails that we have volunteers in (around 200 volunteers)- In addition to the church Bible Studies Outreach Classes and reentry we try to provide a Bible and Daily Bread devotional for any inmates that want one. The Life Recovery Bibles are in great demand. Bible Donations should be marked specifically for those.
- Estimated 45 inmates met with in person for re-entry
- 85 written inmate requests undetermined number of phone calls from inmates and families
- responded to
 Around 190 Daily Breads per 3 months distributed with 210 Easter and 150 Christmas editions.


individual time has come or because He has returned for us all, I hope that we can take this to heart.

- Prayer/Intercession letter sent every 10 days with from 120-300 requests from inmate and volunteer requests.
- More than 300 Bibles given out this year We got so busy getting them out we did not keep track of the number. Thank you to IBG and to the churches and individuals that donated for them!!
- New volunteer orientations take place following application, interview and reference checks. They are held every other month with the placement and training that the county does usually following that.
