1,152,425. It has more people than any other county in Minnesota and the 32nd-most populous county in the United States; more than one in five Minnesotans live in Hennepin County. David Hutchinson was elected Hennepin County Sheriff in 2018.

County Corrections are run by two specific areas: jails and adult detention centers. Those are the places where a person who is arrested goes first. From there, people may be released with conditions such as probation or treatment, may be sen-

tenced to Community Corrections, or if their sentence is longer than a year, to prison. The Sherriff's Department is in charge of the Hennepin County jail, formally called the Adult Detention center. Community Corrections runs the Hennepin Adult Corrections Facility, youth facilities, home monitoring and probation and parole.

The HCJ is a pre-trial facility in downtown Minneapolis. Inmates are housed in the public safety facility and in city hall. There are were 439 inmates and a few days ago there were 26 being medically isolated (no positive tests, just some precaution). In early August there are 392 inmates With aggressive screening the population is 45percent lower than normal. Pray for the inmates to seek God and to pursue spiritual life, especially now when there are no visits or volunteers allowed into the facility. Hours of isolation in cells when they cannot be in the common areas are very difficult on mental health. Asking for prayers about the current situation in Minneapolis with the protests and violence following George Floyd's death are not just general, but are urgent requests.

This jail also houses juveniles who have been charged with adult crimes and are waiting to find out what will happen to them.

The Adult Corrections Facility provides short-term (up to one year) custody and programming for adult offenders convicted of felony, gross misdemeanor, and misdemeanor offenses. It has a capacity of 477 with 399 beds in the men's section and 78 beds for women. The average length of stay is 45 days with 19 percent of residents participating in work/study programs. Currently there are 222 inmates there. Please pray for Chaplain Jeff F., Enell E., Mulbah M., Lois S. and Troy W.



The Juvenile Detention Center and County Home School - The JDC is a secure 24-hour detention facility for juveniles age 10-21 who have been arrested and are awaiting court disposition or placement. The facility has a capacity of 87 beds. The CHS is a state-licensed residential treatment center for juveniles ages 13-20 who have been committed by the court. Year-round school and vocational training augment risk-based, therapeutic programing to improve resident's ability to live productive, responsible lives when they return to their families and communities. Imagine the impact that COVID and the unrest is having on the youth and pray for them! Many are now being give home or

group custody.


