they minister to. Praying with, praying for, encouraging commitment and growth and when able providing information for ongoing discipleship leads us to surrender each to the LORD. "I specifically remember Goodhue County, I don't remember the lady's name. She would come in and do Bible study I remember one of the first verses was; "Be still and Know that I am God" and that Psalms 23 was really important.

There is no place like being in jail to sit still and know that God is in control. It made the Bible really real. To be coming off of drugs and to be able to have peace and connect with God and the Bible was really something. I know that God would not have gotten a hold of me any other way. It took being on drugs and being in jail for Him to reach me. I heard about the Healing House while I was in Ramsey County Workhouse. I met a woman who had been at Metro




Hope when we were in Bible Study together. [MH's Healing House is on MEC's resources.] It was in 2012 and is such a blur, but so important. I felt at peace in jail for the first time for a long time It was almost bitter sweet to get out and go to treatment.

How I found the hope of Christmas or How Christ helped me are two ways to think of what you can include in the note.

If you have a good quality printer and want some Christmas images you can print to make cards we can send some of those to you.

In the past we have put in long hours near Christmas and only been able to cover a couple of jails. Can you help us reach more inmates in this way this year?
